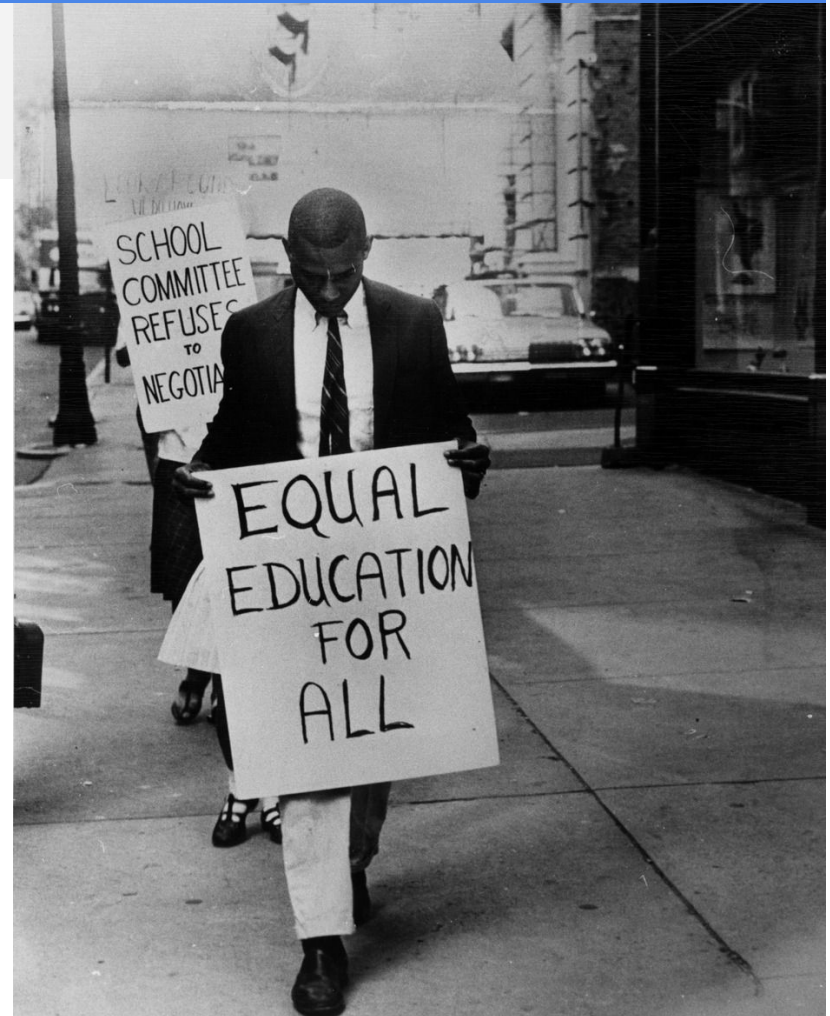

In 1974, as a result of nearly 40 years of civil rights activism, parent agitation, and legal precedent, Judge Garrity issued a comprehensive remedy of approximately 400 orders that attempted to address the true problem of segregated and unequal schools in Boston. ***This is more commonly known as the Boston Busing Crisis.*** The violence that met this decision tore the city apart, the effects of which are still felt today.

Join East Boston-based educators, parents, and activists for a facilitated discussion of former Globe columnist Farah Stockman's series of commentaries on "Boston After Busing." We aim to help East Boston reflect on this history and forge a path toward a more integrated and equitable future.
